### When You are at a Loss for Servicing Your "Special Needs" Youth

Whatever the "special need" may be - a mental health issue, a special education student, the LGBTQ population, or just ordinary adolescent developmental delay factors - in a detention setting, this "high-needs" population drains many staff and administrative resources. This year, at the MJJA conference, the detention workshop track will focus on the "special needs" detention populations - the characteristics they present to the direct care staff, strategies for responding to these characteristics within the structure of a safe and secure environment, and how to advocate for their well-being through healthy interactions with healthy adults in healthy environments.

### **Effective Police Interactions with Youth**

This workshop is designed for law enforcement, and others who want to understand the basic legalities of the Juvenile Court System, and how dealing with youth can be different than adults - both on the street and in the court room. The basic requirements and best practices for custody, as well as child abuse and delinquent investigations, will be covered in the first section of the seminar. The second section will deal with adolescent behavior, effective communication, and awareness of disproportionate minority contact. The overall goal of both sessions is positive youth outcomes.

### Teen Dating Violence and Bullying

The workshop will begin with an overview of Bullying and then some examples of what bullying is, how it affects children, what it looks like, school interventions and school policies. Thursday's session will explain the dynamics of teen dating violence and review relevant resources. It includes an interactive simulation to discuss complexities using real-life scenarios, information about technology and ways it can help and hurt in unhealthy relationships, how to respond to disclosures of abuse, and legal issues pertaining to teens. An overview of Teen and LGBTQ Suicide Prevention will be presented.

### Getting Better ... at Getting Better! Applying Principles of Effective Performance Management

The ability to accomplish something yourself is quite different from the ability to get others to want to do it. The best supervisors and managers hire the best fit people, and then manage performance effectively through a steady routine of measurement and coaching. In most organizations, performance management is widely perceived as an annual chore tied exclusively to merit steps, incentive pay, or whatever form of financial compensation may be offered. Many organizations are feeling the effects of today's downturned economic climate and are finding their results impeded by ineffective performance management systems. By applying new sets of tools and techniques, Juvenile Justice Leaders can make their lives easier while improving commitment, dedication, and results, in spite of shrinking budgets and tighter belts. This course will enable participants to calculate quantitative and qualitative costs of employee turnover, select appropriate data with which to measure performance results, coach performers on effective goal-setting, apply the Nine-Block Talent Assessment to objectively rate team members, and most importantly, inspire and motivate performers toward a climate of trust and continuous improvement, in spite of the increasing velocity of change. Because in today's whirlwind, it is not enough to simply get better. They must get better ... at getting better!

### Prevention of Drug and Alcohol Abuse in Missouri

This track will include information about current trends in substance abuse, including marijuana, alcohol and underage drinking, and heroin. Participants will learn about ACT Missouri and its menu of services, and the Drug and Alcohol Prevention System in Missouri. Brain research and substance abuse will be discussed, as well as Parent 360 and mental health issues that often are found within the realm of substance abuse. DEC101, a strategy for addressing the issue of Drug Endangered Children will be presented as well as other topics related to prevention and intervention.



### From St. Louis

I-70 West to Kingdom City. Hwy 54 through Jefferson City to Lake Ozark (about 45 miles from Jefferson City to Lake Ozark). Turn right at second stoplight on to Business Hwy 54/Bagnell Dam Boulevard. The Resort at Port Arrowhead is approximately I/4 mile on your left.

### From Columbia

Hwy 63 South to Jefferson City. Hwy 54 West to Lake Ozark. Turn right at second stoplight and follow Business Hwy 54/Bagnell dam Boulevard I/4 mile to the hotel.

### From Kansas City

I-70 East to Hwy 65 South to Sedalia. Hwy 50 Each to Tipton. Turn right at stoplight and take South Hwy 5 to East Hwy 52 and follow to Eldon. Turn right at McDonald's and follow to Hwy 54 West and on to Lake Ozark. Turn right at second stoplight onto Business Hwy 54/Bagnell Dam Boulevard. The Resort at Port Arrowhead is approximately I/4 mile on your left.

As an alternative route you can follow Hwy 50 East from Kansas City to Tipton.

### From Springfield, MO

I-44 East to Lebanon. Hwy 5 North to Camdenton. Hwy 54 East to Osage Beach. Turn left on Business Hwy 54/Bagnell Dam Boulevard. The Resort at Port Arrowhead is approximately I/4 mile on left.
